Modes: CW (A1A), SSB (A3J).

Reporting: RS(T) + age (as of January 1 - e.g. if the contestant turned 17 on February 5, 16 will be transmitted)

Scoring:

Ages	70-75	- 2 points (70,71,72,73,74,75)
Ages	76-80	- 3 points (76,77,78,79,80)
Ages	81-85	- 4 points (81,82,83,84)
Ages	≥ 85	- 5 points (85,86)

Multipliers: Various ages/ mode.

Total Score: the sum of points for valid contacts multiplied by the applicable multipliers

Evaluation: All HAM radio stations submitting a logbook will be evaluated.

Log: In CABRILLO format.

Reporting: RS(T) + age (as of January 1 - e.g. if the contestant turned 17 on February 5, 16 will be transmitted) + QRA Locator (e.g. HA5KYZ 599 27 JN97DE)

Scoring: The points for a QSO is calculated as a sum of the points for the age of the operator plus the distance calculated by the QRA Locators!
